DESCRIPTION

This noxious plant is a large, aggressive perennial plant native to East Asia. It features hollow, bamboo-like stems, spade-shaped leaves, and deep underground roots called rhizomes. Brought to North America and Europe as an ornamental garden plant in the 19th century, it is now a notorious invasive species that damages property and chokes out local ecosystems.
